What is Bulldogs in Service?

In the spirit of service, University of Redlands' alumni, parents, students, and friends join together all over the globe to give back to our communities. 2011 marks our fourth annual BIS day.

Where are the projects?

Projects are scattered across the nation and in Salzburg, Austria.

How are the projects selected?

Volunteers find a local community service project and coordinate the work. The call for project ideas is in October and is noted in UR Link and *Och Tamale* magazine.

How do I participate?

Read through the brochure and choose a project where you would like to participate. We encourage you to register online at www.redlands.edu/alumni to ensure that there is still space available at your desired project location. Limits for each location are listed in the project descriptions. You may also complete the registration card at the back of this brochure and return it to the Office of Alumni Relations, call us at 888-UOR-ALUM for assistance, or fax your form to 909-335-3835.

The university will notify the project leader of your interest in participating, who will then communicate project specifics along with directions to the site.

Can I bring my children?

In most cases, yes! A minimum age is specified in the individual project descriptions – the age is different for each project so be sure to check. Adult supervision is required in all cases.

How should I dress and what should I bring?

Dress comfortably, depending on the project, you may need layers and not mind getting dirty. Closed toe shoes are a requirement at every venue – no sandals or flip flops, please. Once you've registered, your project leader will provide you with specifics and answer any additional questions.

Will someone ask me to make a donation?

Absolutely not. Participating in BIS costs nothing, and is solely focused on giving back to the community. If you would like to purchase a 2011 BIS shirt, mark the appropriate box on the registration form.

What if I don't live in a BIS project city?

We're sorry about that. We encourage everyone to consider making April 9, 2011 a day of community service wherever you live. If you'd like to chair a project next year for your city, please let us know by returning the registration form with your contact information.

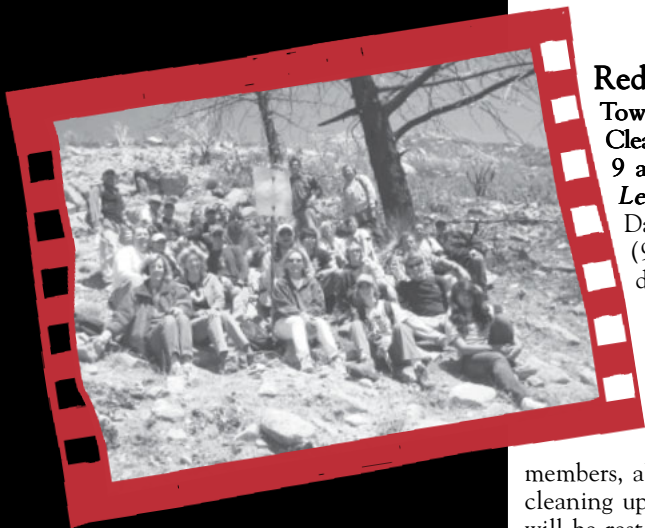

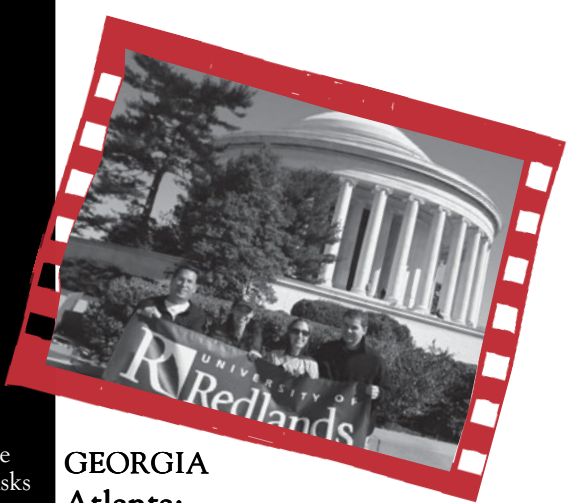
