ABOUT KELSIE VALENZUELA

Kelsie Valenzuela is a pianist and Redlands native whose playing is characterized by powerful technique and sensitive lyricism. Through countless experiences, including studying aboard in Salzburg, Austria, Mrs. Valenzuela discovered a genuine love for sharing music with listeners and programming pieces that inspire and captivate audiences through musical storytelling. One of her recent recitals consisted of all Bach transcriptions for piano and emphasized the legacy of Ferruccio Busoni. In April, after three rigorous rounds of competition, Mrs. Valenzuela was named a prizewinner in the annual University of Redlands Concerto Competition. Her performance of Edvard Grieg's Piano Concerto in A Minor, Op. 16, marks her exciting debut with orchestra.

Mrs. Valenzuela is a graduate of the University of Redlands, where she received her Master of Music in Piano Performance in April of 2023. She studied with renowned teacher and performer Louanne Long, also serving as her Assistant for two years. She is the recipient of numerous prizes and honors, including the reputable LeHigh Endowed piano scholarship. In April 2020, she graduated Magna Cum Laude with a Bachelors in Piano Performance from the University of Redlands and was awarded membership in Pi Kappa Lambda, the National Honor Society for exemplary musical achievement. From a young age, she participated in both local and international competitions, including the International Liszt Competition of 2018, and was frequently featured in concerts as a member of chamber groups and piano-duo ensembles. Twice she was chosen to appear as a soloist on the prestigious University of Redlands President's Honor Recital.

Mrs. Valenzuela's passion for people, combined with her passion for music, compels her to inspire others through the art of piano. She is cofounder of an in-home concert series sponsored by Redlands Town and Gown. This series aims to bring musical performances into private homes for the enjoyment of music in small group settings. She also maintains a full private studio of students ranging in age and level and is currently the Co-Director for the annual University of Redlands Summer Piano Camp. Mrs. Valenzuela is also an active member of the Music Teacher's Association of California, where she serves as 1st Vice President of the Redlands Branch.

ABOUT DANG HUU PHUC

Dang Huu Phuc is a composer and pianist based in Hanoi, Vietnam. He majored in both and composition and piano performance at the Vietnam National Academy of Music. Between 1991 and 1992, he studied composition at the Conservatoire National Superieur de Musique et de Danse de Paris. He currently teaches composition at the Vietnam National Academy of Music in Hanoi. Dang frequently utilizes Vietnamese traditional music in his compositions. They mostly follow the Neoclassicism and Nationalist movements. Dang has written instrumental music (for chamber groups and orchestra), songs, music for motion pictures and the theater. He won the prize of Best Musical Score at the Shanghai International Film Festival in 2005.

In "Dance of Chèo and Lên đồng" written for the symphony orchestra in 2019, Dang Huu Phuc draws upon famous melodies and rhythm from Chèo and Lên đồng to depict the festive scenery of Vietnamese villages during traditional festivals. Chèo is a one of three types of traditional operas in Vietnam. It is very popular in the North, especially in the area surrounding the Red River. The plots usually reflect the cultural and social beliefs of Vietnamese people. Lên Đồng is one of many ritual practices in Nothern Vietnam. During the ceremony, the main singer goes into a trance, and become a spirit medium. As such, their songs and dance are believed to represent various deities.
