WHAT IS THE PERFORMANCE ACADEMY

If you are a serious pianist who is passionate about music and enjoys performing, the <u>Performance Academy</u> may be for you. This summer, through audition, the Academy will be composed of a select group of up to ten very talented pianists between the ages of 13-18, students who will spend a portion of the camp day meeting together with Professors and Artist Performers for Masterclasses and hot-topic seminars related to piano. Students accepted to the Academy will experience the unique blend of fun, camaraderie, and creative exploration offered by the University of Redlands Piano Camp, combined with the more concentrated pre-college/conservatory-like focus of the Academy. THE AUDITION VIDEO

Entrance to the **Performance Academy** is by video audition.

- 1. Audition repertory:
 - Two or more pieces in contrasting styles. You many choose freely from the standard repertoire (Baroque, Classical, Romantic, or Contemporary).
 - One of the audition pieces should be a piece ready to perform for a masterclass.
 - Pieces should be memorized.
 - Minimum total performance time limit is 7 minutes; maximum total time limit is 15 minutes.
- 2. Instructions for recording:
 - Recording may be made with your phone.
 - Each piece must be submitted in one continuous video, without editing.
 - A side view (concert view) of your whole body must be included in the frame. Hands must be clearly visible on the keys. Recital attire is preferred.
 - Before performing each piece, announce the title of the piece and the name of the composer.
 - At the beginning of the video, introduce yourself briefly and tell us one thing you particularly enjoy about playing the piano.

Summary of Courses and Activities

A. BASICS FOR EVERYONE*

B. APPLIED SKILLS (choose one)

No previous experience in these areas is necessary.

Adventures in Composition

The Composition class will explore fascinating aspects of music creation. The course includes experimentation with diverse sound sources, working with modern as well as traditional methods of notation, and exploring principles of form, tension/resolution, character, and mood.

• Accompanying – The Pianist as Partner

Students in this class will explore the skills needed to be a fine collaborator. They will have the unique opportunity of preparing music with another instrumentalist and/or vocalist.

Jazz Improvisation

Step by step in this course you will learn the art of inventing melodic lines over jazz chord progressions, whether using particular tunes you love or creating fresh melodies on the spot. There will be opportunity for listening to and discussing performances of famous jazz artists. A highlight of the course will be the jam sessions in combo style with other members of the class.

• Organ for Pianists: "Keyboards Across the Ages"

In this introduction to the organ, each student will have a hands-on opportunity to perform on the mighty four-manual Casavant organ in Memorial Chapel, the premier French organ in Southern California. Additionally, students will explore the similarities and differences among the piano, organ, clavichord, and harpsichord.

C. MUSICAL EXPLORATIONS (choose one)

• Music and ART: "Putting Sound on Paper"

Students will uncover the common elements that shape music and art, in particular those of color, texture and form. Using a variety of raw materials, and inspired by musical examples, each student will have a chance to create their own artwork as a combination of sight and sound.

• Music and DRAMA: "Lights! Music! Action! How to Make a Scene."

Students will uncover the dramatic elements within a musical composition by studying a broad range of emotions and discovering the means by which composers convey their feelings. Class activities include listening as well as script writing, physical enactment and performance.

Music in MOTION: "Who's got the beat!"

Have you ever found yourself tapping your toes or clapping along to an upbeat piece of music? Rhythm is the foundation of music, no matter the style. In this exciting and creative class, the campers will be out of their seats and up on their feet, playing a variety of rhythm games and learning how to move along with the music they are hearing. Also included are demonstrations of fun dance steps such as a minuet, waltz, and even a hoe-down!

Music and MULTI-MEDIA: "Listening with our Eyes!"

In addition to documenting the daily activities of Piano Camp, students will create a "Nature Symphony" on film, juxtaposing nature scenes they videotape on location around campus with the recorded piano performances of other campers. Students will learn the basics of videography, including how to handle a camera, sound recording, and editing.
