Global Quarter California Excursions

This year Residence Life and Housing (RLH) offered a new opportunity to engage with our international student community known as California Excursions. These unique culturally immersive experiences invited international students to visit local landmarks in Southern California. This pilot program utilized funds primarily from the Office of International Student Scholars (OISS) and had Resident Directors leading the local excursions. California Excursions are an example of Academic and Student Affairs working together in order to help our international students find a sense of belonging at the U of R.
