# PRELIMINARY TEACHING CREDENTIAL, SINGLE SUBJECT UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

### **UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS**

Students from the College of Arts and Sciences interested in earning a teaching credential must apply to the School of Education. Undergraduate students can enroll in Child Development (EDUG 331) and Educational Foundations (EDUG 401) before the School of Education admission process. Students need to contact an enrollment counselor to discuss the best credential program pathway.

#### SOE ADMISSON REQUIREMENTS

- Completed application. Learn more about applying to the School of Education.
- Cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher
- Evidence of negative TB test result within the last 2 years
- Evidence of Certificate of Clearance
- Meet basic skills requirement
- Evidence of subject matter competency. Completion of waiver program or passage of CSET (Equivalency is
  determined by CTC). May show evidence of registration for the exam for application purposes but will need to
  pass exam before student teaching.
- Evidence of 50 hours of observation or work with children, preferably in a public-school setting or equivalent
- Completion of Child Development (EDUG 331)
- Two recommendations from professionals who know the applicant's capacity for academic work
- · Admission decisions are made by the Departmental Admissions Committee

#### ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR CREDENTIALS

To be eligible to be recommended for the Preliminary Teaching Credential or the Preliminary Education Specialist Credential, candidates must meet the U.S. Constitution requirement. For details on meeting this requirement, contact the School of Education. Introduction to American Politics (POLI 111) or American History to 1877 (HIST 121), in the College of Arts and Sciences, or their equivalents, satisfy the requirement.

### **PATHWAYS**

Students from the College of Arts and Sciences will work in collaboration with their CAS advisor and their School of Education advisor to customize an academic plan. Pathways provided by the School of Education are suggested schedules. Students may take foundations and methods courses in any order prior to student-teaching.
