Program Structure

1. Foundational Theology Course –“Practices and Pilgrimages: Event Design and Pedagogy for Spiritual Entrepreneurs”
Build a cohort experience, a grounding in the principles of spiritual entrepreneurship, and the honing of a spiritual entrepreneurial project to be explored in the rest of the certificate courses.

2. Theology Elective Course Relevant to Your Vocation
Delve into a field of theological/spiritual study related to the business venture being explored.

- Evolving the Entrepreneurial Mindset
- Validating a startup’s idea through deep customer discovery (using the “SLAM” diagram)
- Executing effectively on the Startup plan (using the “GRAND” diagram)
- Pitching for funding to Customers and Investors and maintaining momentum
