The Master of Divinity (M.Div.) is the foundational degree for ministry and is required for ordination in many Christian traditions. This degree also prepares students for other professional ministries, including congregational leadership, chaplaincy, campus ministry, spiritual direction, counseling, not-for-profit work, and other community-based ministries.

Critical thinking, pluralism, and spirituality are central to our M.Div. program, preparing you to bridge theological, cultural, and political divides.
