Race on Campus is a student-led conference designed to build community, share ideas, and explore experiences of race on, and sometimes off of, college campuses. The class will be co-facilitated by students in conjunction with Professor Zack Ritter, a former staff member and community organizer from the Claremont Colleges. The class is a non-hierarchical student collective dedicated to creating a space for students from the university and other institutions to have open, honest, and vulnerable dialogue about how race manifests in our lives and in higher education. This will be the 4th annual Race on Campus event, and will take place the weekend of **March 29th to the 31st**.

What you can expect throughout this course are opportunities to learn, grow and understand differences in thoughts, ideas and values. As a collective, we will join thematic groups that spark the passions of each individual and in those groups opportunities to engage in on and off campus events will arise. Class time will be structured by weekly agendas determined by these thematic groups. Individuals will have the opportunity to explore race theory, methods of expressing race through art, community organizing and engaging in meaningful and essential conversations.

Though each group will be focussing on a different element of the conference, the collective will continue to embrace a model of consensus to ensure that each moving part of the event is working together intentionally and cohesively.
