


2023 Graduation Survey Summary

Response Rate

79 (of 330 total) students responded to the Graduation Survey (23.94%).


Modality Information

Out of 79 respondents, 110 (76.39%) indicated that they primarily attended courses in the Online Live modality, 10 (6.94%) indicated that they primarily attended courses in the On-Ground modality, 3 (2.08%) indicated that they primarily attended courses in the Connected Campus modality, and 21 (14.58%) indicated that they primarily attended courses in the Online (asynchronous) modality.




Program Information

The 330 students who were invited to respond to the survey broke down by program as follows:




Out of 79 respondents to the survey, 24 (30.38 %) responded that they are earning a Bachelor of Science in Business, 28 (35.44%) that they are earning a Master of Business Administration, 21 (26.58%) that they are earning a Master of Science in Organizational Leadership, and 6 (7.59%) that they are earning a Master of Science in Business Analytics. The 1% indicated under "Other" refers to legacy programs that students are finishing.

Industry Sectors


89.88% of respondents indicated that they are currently employed. Of those, 95.77% indicated that they are currently working full-time. Their employment by sector is as follows:



Respondents indicating "other" included Hospitality (4.23%), Software (2.82%), Aerospace (1.14%), Architecture (1.14%), and Operations (1.14%).

Salaries

Of the respondents who indicated they are currently employed, 4.23% indicated they earn an annual salary of \$0 - \$20,000, 14.08% earn \$20,001-\$40,000, 15.49% earn \$40,001-\$60,000, 19.72% earn \$60,001-\$80,000, 15.49% earn \$80,001-\$100,000, 14.08% earn \$100,001-\$120,000, 8.45% earn \$120,001-\$140,000, and 8.45% earn over \$140,000.
