

Let's look at our 10-day itinerary of business visits, academic presentations, and cultural excursions. And yes, there will be plenty of time for you to explore on your own!

→ Day 1: Wednesday, April 3 CAMBRIDGE

Arrive in Cambridge, England, and check into the Arundel House hotel for a three-night stay. Explore the cobblestoned city center, see Newton's and Darwin's notebooks in the Cambridge University library, or relax a bit before our welcome dinner at The Architect, a traditional English pub!

Rest of the day is yours to explore – go punting on the River Cam, devour some fish and chips at the historic Eagle Pub, or climb the famous St. Mary's church for panoramic views of the city.



→ Day 4: Saturday, April 6 CAMRBIDGE to LONDON

Transfer to London via private motorcoach. Along the way, we will stop in Tottenham to visit Redemption Brewery, a "Living Wage London" certified employer, and Prestige Patisserie, a bakery owned by Romanian immigrants who started their business in their own small kitchen and recently were semi-finalists on the Great British Baking Show: The Professionals. Late afternoon arrival at Holiday Inn Bloomsbury for a four-night stay. Receive London transportation tickets.

→ Day 5: Sunday, April 7 LONDON

Free day to explore London. Students are invited to conduct their field studies. All participants are encouraged to explore London's sights and sounds: visit some of London's famous museums, take a spin on the London Eye, see what's going on at Buckingham Palace, taste your way through Brick Lane's curry shops, see a West End play, or walk along the Thames to see Shakespeare's Globe Theatre. Possibilities are endless!



→ Day 6: Monday, April 8 LONDON

Business visits throughout the day today. More details to come. Evening is yours to explore London.

In the afternoon, we will enjoy a guided walking tour of some of Paris's most famous sights and architecture. Evening is free for you to enjoy the City of Lights.

Business visits over the next two days include a farming startup that grows gardens in Paris parking lots, two organizations that focus on teaching computer and coding skills to refugees, and a champagne entrepreneur who supports women-owned businesses in Paris.

Continuation of business visits including a farming startup that grows gardens in Paris parking lots, two organizations that focus on teaching computer and coding skills to refugees, and a champagne entrepreneur who supports women-owned businesses in Paris. In the evening, we will gather for our farewell dinner at a classic Parisian bistro!



WHAT ARE THE COURSE REQUIREMENTS?

PRE-TRAVEL → PHASE

Pre-departure class sessions and assignments to prepare participants for the experiential learning component of the course


TRAVEL PHASE (on location)

Business visits, academic lectures and seminars, and cultural activities

POST-TRAVEL PHASE

Integration of learning after travel.

Travel journal and research paper, etc.



WHAT IF I'M TAKING ANOTHER COURSE WHEN THE TRIP OCCURS?

- Most students take another course during the study abroad. It's OK! You DO NOT need to choose a trip that coincides with when your course substitution occurs.
- If you will be enrolled in another course during your study abroad trip, you will need to work with your student success advisor to contact the instructor of the course.
- Because you may miss a class session, you and your instructor will complete the "Concurrent Enrollment Agreement" to determine make-up assignment requirements.
- The completed Concurrent Enrollment Agreement must be submitted to the Dean's Office before departure.

WHAT SITES DO WE VISIT?

- Major cultural landmarks in cities

WHAT'S INCLUDED IN THE PRICE?

- Ground & air transportation in foreign countries
- Accommodation (doubleoccupancy) in businessclass style hotels
- Foreign tuition and costs associated with business visits
- Admission and accompanying costs for events and cultural excursions included in the program.

Participants arrange their own transportation to the lodging location where the program begins and back home from the lodging location where the program ends.

The School provides a recommended travel agent to assist with bookings, and faculty flight itineraries will be communicated if you would like to travel with faculty members.

- Guests under 16 may be permitted under certain circumstances and on a case-by-case basis.
- The trip cost for guests is the same as the trip cost for students. Guests do not, of course, pay tuition.



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
