

# **2022 MSOL Graduation Survey Summary**

## **Program Information**

Out of 144 respondents 33 (22.92%) responded that they are pursuing a Master of Science in Organizational Leadership.

## **Tuition Discount**

Out of the 33 SBS respondents who earned a MSOL degree, 21 (63.64 %) indicated they received some form of tuition discount.

## **Classroom Modality**

Most of the MSOL student respondents took the majority of their classes in the Online Live (synchronous) modality.


## Measures of Student Satisfaction - Degree Value, MSOL Students

Though less than half experienced a direct benefit by the time of graduation, most students believe that their degree will ultimately lead to increased earning potential and career advancement.

## **Employment - MSOL Students<sup>1</sup>**


## **Industry Sectors**

### **Employment Outcomes**

Of the respondents in the Master of Science in Organizational Leadership program, 85.71% said that their degree is relevant to their current job, 92.86% said their degree has improved their overall job performance, and 71.43% said their bosses or executives see them as a more valuable employee in their current role. 57.14% said their degree has increased their earning power, 21.43% said their degree has helped them earn a promotion, and 35.71% said their degree has helped them change jobs.

## **Degree Goals**

Of the respondents in the Master of Science in Organizational Leadership program, 92.86% said their intent in pursuing their degree was to increase their earning power, 85.71% said their intent in pursuing their degree was to earn a promotion, 78.57% and said their intent in pursuing their degree was to change jobs. 100% said their degree will increase their earning power within the next 5 years.
