


 All teacher candidates complete 6 foundations and methods courses.

 Each program requires a culminating fieldwork experience (student teaching, internship, or residency) and a teaching seminar course.



Fieldwork Overview



Fieldwork

CTC requires that all teacher candidates complete 600 hours of fieldwork across the arc of their program.

600 Hours of Fieldwork



40 Hours (MS/SS) or 200 hours (EDSP)

• Early Fieldwork during Foundation and Methods Courses



560 hours (MS/SS) or 400 Hours (EDSP)

• Student Teaching or Teaching Internship



FIELDWORK EXPERIENCE

STUDENT TEACHING TEACHING INTERNSHIP Solo teacher in the classroom. Hosted by a Cooperating Teacher. Placement Coordinated by OSS. Paid position with benefits. Must find internship on own. Applications, Instructions & Deadlines

Preparing for Student Teaching



Be aware of applications deadlines, requirements and submit everything on time.



Use Early Fieldwork as an opportunity to observe teachers, network and connect with the districts.



If possible, sub in the district to connect with teachers and principals. You may really like a school site and request to be placed there.



Be open minded about where you will be placed and what you will learn.



Preparing for an Internship



Be aware of deadlines to confirm an internship and application requirements.



Use Early Fieldwork as an opportunity to observe teachers, network, and connect with districts.



Use subbing and longterm sub positions as a way to network and gain experience.



Search EdJoin.



Consider what type of school you want to want and learn in.



Connect with the Office of Career and Professional Development.



Credential Requirements



Preliminary Credential Requirements

* = submitted in application to the School of Education

Have already met

- Evidence of a bachelor's degree from a regionally-accredited institution*
- Evidence of Basic Skills Requirement*
- Current Certificate of Clearance issued by CTC*
- Evidence of negative TB test result (skin tests within the last two years or chest x-ray exams within the last five years)*

Work on during semester 1 & 2

- Evidence of Subject Matter Competency
- Valid CPR certificate (infant, child and adult)
- Evidence of the U.S. Constitution requirement
- RICA passed (MS and EDSP)

Complete by end of program

- TPE Porfolio (EDSP completed during seminar courses)
- CalTPA cycle I and II passed (all MS/SS and EDSP summer 2022 or after program start)
- · All teacher-prep coursework completed, and grades posted
- Clear student account



CREDENTIAL RECOMMENDATION



Complete foundation, methods, and fieldwork courses with grades posted.



Submit credential application.



OSS Advisor will review application and submit recommendation to CTC (2-3 weeks).



Applicants will receive email from CTC to pay credential fee.



CTC will process recommendation (10 business days).



Subject Matter Competency

If you have not met Subject Matter Competency yet, you must do so in order to apply for student teaching or an internship.



Subject Matter Competency can be met through:

Examination
(all CSET
subtests
passed)

Academic Degree

Coursework*

Combination of coursework and examination*



US Constitution Requirement

This credential requirement can be met through a couple of ways:

- If you graduated from a CSU
- If you took a course that covered the US Constitution as a topic. See the list of approved courses or contact your advisor.
- Take the online exam.



CalTPA Requirement

Multiple Subject & Single Subject

Must pass the CalTPAs

Education Specialist

If you started your program in Spring 2022 or prior, you **do not** need to complete the CalTPAs

If you started your program in Summer 2022 or after, you *will* need to complete the CalTPAs
