- <u>US Constitution Requirement</u>: Recommend to complete during semester 1.
- <u>RICA Exam</u>: Must be met for Preliminary Credential recommendation. Recommend to complete after meeting subject matter competency.
- <u>CalTPA Cycle 1 and 2</u>: Must be met for Preliminary Credential recommendation. Will be completed during student teaching or teaching residency.
