WHAT IS THE CPCE EXAM?

The California Preparation Comprehensive Examination (CPCE) is an exit exam required of all DCHS students in Clinical Mental Health Counseling & School Counseling programs

- The exam aims to assess the student's knowledge of counseling to ensure you are ready to venture out into the field
- The CPCE Exam also provides collective feedback that faculty can use in the DCHS programs in developing & adapting curriculum

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WHAT IS ON THE EXAM?

There are 8 sections

Human Development

Understanding the nature and needs of individuals at all developmental levels

Social and Cultural Foundations

• Understanding of issues and trends in a multicultural and diverse society

Helping Relationships

Understanding of counseling and consultation process

Group Work

• Understanding of group development, dynamics, counseling theories, group counseling methods and skills, and other group work approaches



Sections cont.

Career and Lifestyle Development

Understanding of career development and related life factors

Appraisal

Understanding of individual and group approaches to assessment and evaluation

Research and Program Evaluation

 Understanding of types of research methods, basic statistics, and ethical and legal considerations in research

Professional Orientation and Ethics

 Understanding of all aspects of professional functioning, including history, roles, organizational structures, ethics, standards, and credentialing



HOW MANY QUESTIONS ARE ON THE EXAM?

In total, there are 160 questions

- There are 20 questions per category
 - Only 17 of those 20 questions will be scored





WHEN CAN I START TAKING THE CPCE EXAM?

It's best to take the Exam as close to graduation as possible

- It's recommended starting in the 5th term/having accumulated 35 credits
- For PPS Credential only students, 2nd term



WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW TO REGISTER FOR THE EXAM?

You MUST register for the exam at minimum ONE month prior to the administration date of the exam

Your advisor can help register you

There are THREE ways the test is administered. The cost depends on where you take your test


- At the University of Redlands (\$75)
- At the Pearson Examination Center (\$150)
- Virtually (\$150)



DO I NEED TO ENROLL IN EDUC 699 IN ORDER TO TAKE THE EXAM?

Yes, you will enroll in EDUC 699 during the term you plan to take the exam

- When the student passes the exam, it will be counted as credit (CR)
- If you do not pass, it will remain as an incomplete (I) until the exam is passed



ACCOMODATIONS

If you will be needing accomodations they can be provided for you at the Pearson Center and on campus at the U of R

 However, it is recommended that the test be taken at the U of R through the Academic Success and Accessibility (ASA) office

HOW DO I PASS THE EXAM?

School Counseling students must pass with a minimum score of 72

Clinical Mental Health students must pass with a minimum score of 84

- The exam can be retaken. Students are given 3 opportunities to pass
- Before retaking, students should meet with Program Coordinator to develop a comprehensive plan to prepare
- After 3rd failed attempt, the DCHS faculty will determine if the student can demonstrate the knowledge required to pass the exam

Results

Results will be available within 48 hours of taking the exam in your Student Profile on the Pearson VUE website

- The results will be sent to your OSS advisor if you are taking the exam on campus
- If test is taken off-campus, you must send your test results to your advisor
